RECOMMENDED MAJORS/MINORS:

Environmental Studies, Biology or Chemistry majors/minors

You can earn your Peace Corps Prep Certificate by taking classes in your major, fulfilling your Global and General Education requirements* plus the following: Foreign Language, Career Development and Leadership, and/just 50 hours service or an internship.

PEACE CORPS PREP REQUIREMENTS:

Three of the following courses with 3+ credits each:

50 hours experience fulfilled through any of the following:

- Internship related to environmental remediation, research, maintenance or education (2 credits or 1 credit + 8 hours)
- 50 volunteer hours related to environmental remediation, research, maintenance or education.

Foreign Language:

All coursework may be substituted by passing a proficiency test at the intermediate level.

- **Latin America placement (Spanish):** Strong intermediate proficiency or Two 200 level courses in Spanish
- **West Africa placement (French):** Intermediate proficiency in French or other romance language or One 200 level course in French or other romance language.

- **Everywhere else:** Proficiency in language of target country or similar language helpful. Study in a foreign language required for certificate or 4 credits of college level foreign language.

Intercultural Competence

Required GL425 class, plus two of the following courses.

Note: One course may be substituted by 50 additional service hours working with new Americans/immigrants in the community, teaching in diverse schools, or volunteering abroad.**
