Transfer Agreements

Wilmington College values the education a student receives at a two-year institution or community college. We also understand that completing a bachelor's degree is a priority for community college graduates. Wilmington College has made the transfer process seamless for students who have graduated with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree OR have completed the Ohio Transfer Module (OTM) requirements from a regionally accredited institution.

Students, who have been admitted to Wilmington College and have earned an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science from a regionally accredited institution, will have fulfilled general education requirements at Wilmington College.

Students, who have been admitted to Wilmington College and have completed the OTM at a regionally accredited institution, will have fulfilled general education requirements at Wilmington College.

OTM completion must be indicated on the student's official transcript from the institution.

Transfer Awards

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

\$14,000 per year

Must be a member of Phi Theta Kappa at most recently attended institution with 3.5–4.0 cumulative college grade point average.

Transfer Honor Scholarship 1

\$12,000 per year

Must have 3.5–4.0 cumulative college grade point average and completion of 12 or more hours of transferable college coursework.

Transfer Honor Scholarship 2

\$11,000 per year

Must have 3.0–3.49 cumulative college grade point average and completion of 12 or more hours of transferrable college coursework.

Transfer Honor Scholarship

\$10,000 per year

Must have 2.3–2.99 cumulative college grade point average and completion of 12 or more hours of transferrable college coursework.

Heritage Awards

Quaker Award \$2,500 per year

Student must be an active member of their Yearly Meeting and submit recommendation letter from pastor or clerk speaking to their Meeting involvement, or student is a graduate from a Quaker high school.

Legacy Award \$2,500 per year

Student's parent, step-parent, grandparent, great grandparent or sibling must be a graduate of WC or sibling must be attending Wilmington College in the current academic year.

Wilmington College Multi-Cultural Award \$2,000 per year

Awarded at the time of admission to traditionally under-represented populations. Qualifying ethnicity must be included on the Application for Admission at the time of submission.

Awards of Circumstance

Pathways Grant

\$500 per year**

Must be accepted to the College and have visited campus via a recruiting event by May 1, 2019

Gateway Grant

\$2,500 per year

Available to students whose state of legal residence is not Ohio as of July 1, 2018.

Talent Awards

Pep Band Award \$1,000 per year*

Offered to students who submit a Pep Band Participation Application during the admission process.

IHSA Equestrian Team Talent Award

\$1,500 per year*

Offered to students who submit a Riding Team Participation Application during the admission process.

Scout Awards up to \$1,500*

The Girl Scout Gold Award – awarded to Gold Award recipients in possession of their Gold Award certificates.

The Scouts BSA Eagle Scout Award – awarded to Eagle Scout recipients in possession of their Eagle Scout certificates.

- Have a transfer recommendation form filled out by the Director of Student Affairs and sent in
- Submit the FAFSA to WC at www.fafsa.gov, use the Wilmington College FAFSA Code: 003142
