**YEAR ONE NOTES:** RP 132-133 Introduction to the Bible and RP 140 Introduction to Philosophy are offered every fall, and most students would take one or the other, but not both, first semester. In the second semester, students intending to pursue the Eco-Ethics Concentration in the RP major should take RP 239 Values and Ethics (offered every spring), while students pursuing the Peace and Nonviolence Concentration should take PC 233 Intro Peace and Conflict Studies if it is offered, though any of the four 200 level courses listed will fulfill the requirements for all three concentrations in the RP major.

**YEAR TWO NOTES:** In the fall semester of the second year, students would typically take RP 240-241 Comparative Religion I-II, along with either RP 132-133 Intro Bible I-II, or RP 140 Introduction to Philosophy. Starting in the spring of the second year, students would normally be able to begin taking 300-400 level coursework in RP as determined by the particular concentration in the RP major (Religion and Philosophy, Peace and Nonviolence, Eco-Ethics) they have chosen.

**YEAR FOUR NOTES:** In their final year/seventh and eighth semesters, students in the Peace and Nonviolence and Eco-Ethics concentrations are required to either do an Internship (PC/RP 470) or Senior Project (RP 495), though students pursuing the more general Religion and Philosophy concentration have this option as well.
