YEAR FOUR NOTES: You will need a passing score on your Primary Education content test by October of Semester 7 in order to student teach in Semester 8. You will not be permitted to student teach without that passing score. You must also complete an application for student teaching during Semester 7; your ED485 site supervisor will help you. Student teaching is a 15-week experience and you will follow the calendar and schedule of your school district. You will attend seminar on Wednesday afternoons on campus. You must complete the edTPA project during student teaching and meet the state-set cut score of 37 in order to successfully pass the project.
